

SUMMER TERM CURRICULUM INFORMATION**Year Group: 6****Date: April 2026**

English	
In the first half term, we will be recapping key literacy skills such as spelling rules and patterns, punctuation and grammatical devices. The children will also continue to complete a range of different styles of writing such as, narratives, letters, diary entries, scripts and other non-fiction pieces of writing. In the second half of the term, we will be exploring the works of Shakespeare and how to produce a play script.	
Maths	
In the first half term, the children will revisit concepts covered earlier in the year. The second half term they will focus on real life problems and the use of mathematics in every day life – measuring skills, collecting data and presenting results. They will then interpret patterns and relationships between results. This is a transition unit and preparation for secondary transfer.	
French	
In the first half term, the children will be studying the theme of <u>Café culture and restaurants</u> . They will be looking at French food culture and etiquette, discuss foods and drinks that they like/dislike as well as creating their own menus. The children will then move onto investigating sports. The focus will be on understanding and remembering sport nouns, discuss likes and dislikes and describing sports using simple sentences.	
Computing	Design & Technology
Children will be exploring 3D modelling using a computer and how to code a programmable device.	Children will be taking part in a cookery unit making quiches.
Geography and History	
In geography, we will be looking at sustainability and how schools can reduce waste. In history, we will be exploring crime and punishment and how this has changed over time in Britain.	
Art	Music
To explore manga (a form of Japanese comics that has a distinctive style and a wide range of genres and themes).	Popular culture music. Upper Key Stage 2 Production.
PE	PSHE
In Summer 1, we will be learning how to play baseball. In Summer 2, we will be learning how to play rounders. The children will also take part in sports day representing their school houses.	This term, we will be looking at Money Matters and budgeting as well as Growing Up (health and wellbeing). We will also take part in some transitional activities in preparation for secondary school.
Homework	
Thank you all for the continuing support and encouragement you have given your child with their homework. Homework will be less intensive in the final term. However, we do stress the importance of reading regularly – this enables children to enter secondary school as fluent and confident readers. We will also be continuing with our weekly spelling tests up until the end of the academic year. Having a secure knowledge and rapid recall of number bonds and quick calculation methods as well as times tables is also vital.
