

Governor Visit Report – Harlyn Primary School

<i>Focus of Visit</i> To discuss the current procedures in regards to Pupil Premium.	
<i>Summary of the activities</i> Meeting with Shruit as Pupil Premium lead. Current Pupil Premium Strategy was read and digested prior to the meeting. Discussion based on Strategy, systems within school, impact & monitoring,	
<i>What I have learned from my visit</i> - There are currently approximately 5-6 pupil premium children in each class, there are more in Year 4 and Year 6. These pupils are from a range of abilities. Leaders have a register of these pupils and they are discussed during weekly monitoring in SLT meetings. Pupils are highlighted on assessment data and provision overviews. A vulnerable pupil audit is completed termly which is then shared with class teachers and relevant staff - training and support is then provided by the inclusion team where required. - Pupil progress meetings are purposeful in sharing information about pupils as well as allowing class teachers to comment on impact of intervention - this ensures that any progress made is being mirrored in the classroom and not just standalone within the intervention. For pupils who are double disadvantaged (ie. Pupil Premium and SEND) support is provided via inclusion team. Pupil Premium children who are working at the age related standard or above are supported through 'Quality First Teaching' but they are yet to receive any support 'above and beyond' non pupil premium students. This will need addressing. - Pupil Premium Grant is currently used to subsidise clubs and school journey for relevant pupils. - Harlyn's Pupil Premium Strategy is currently written collaboratively and is in line with the school's academic year. DfE requires for this to be updated annually with the most recent document to be available on the school website from 31st December each year. The current strategy states that the school is in its third year and therefore objectives will need to be reviewed in the next year. - Shruti is new to the role and has shared that she would like to increase her knowledge and confidence through appropriate training - possibly via the Local Authority. - The office currently leads on promoting sign up to the Pupil Premium funding. As 'universal school meals' are currently in place, there is little incentive for parents to be added to the list - the school could potentially increase their funding if this was promoted further (currently at £1515 per eligible pupil per year. £350 per service child).	
<i>Idea for future visits</i> - Discussion regarding new Pupil Premium Strategy when completed (December 2025) - Update meeting with Shruti to discuss review of current targets and how the funding is being promoted. - I would like the opportunity to see support in place for Pupil Premium within the classroom, particularly for pupils at the age related standard and above - what is in place academically to challenge these pupils further.
