Spellings and Homework

Spellings and homework are given out every **Friday** and the children will be tested on their spellings the following Friday, giving them a week to learn them! No homework or spellings are given out for half term or holidays.

Homework books are due in on the following Friday.

Every week:

- Spellings
- Maths including learning their times tables
- English/reading comprehension

Homework is put onto the year 3 section of the newsletter each week, so please check this if the homework sheet is mislaid.

Maths Homework



Children will have weekly Maths homework to reinforce and consolidate their learning during the week.

This could be a written task which is to be completed in their homework book or an online Doodle Maths task.

Children will be expected to practise their times tables each week.

Projects

Projects will occasionally be set and we will usually allow 3 weeks to be completed.



Reading!



Complete home Reading Record daily - ONLY 1 read per day is counted toward reading certificates.

Please read as many different books and genres as often as possible!

Reading books and reading records should be in school everyday!

Non school books can be recorded as home reads as well as school books.

- You don't have to read the whole book. A few pages (age appropriate) followed by some questions is plenty and can still be recorded and numbered.
- We ask that the children read every day but we realise that some days will be missed due to a busy schedule. We do ask that they read on MOST days.
- You can read; school books, library books, comics, flash cards, sentences that you have written and all these can be recorded and numbered.

Here is an example of how to record your child's reading.

- Number each DAY that your child reads not each time they read. (see example)

- Don't add a number if your child has read in school, we only count the number of reads that the children do at home.

- We know that lives are very busy, so sometimes simply signing that they have read, without a comment is fine.

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The children will earn reading certificates when they reach reading milestones. Below are some examples. Your child's teacher will issue a certificate when they see the number in the reading record that matches the appropriate certificate e.g 50 reads numbered/ recorded by adults at home in the reading record, will mean your child earns the Bronze Reader certificate. The following pages will show you how to record your children's reading at home so that they can earn certificates to bring home.

- Mental Arithmetic & 2 Reasoning papers
- Reading paper (comprehension)
- Spellings
- Grammar and Punctuation

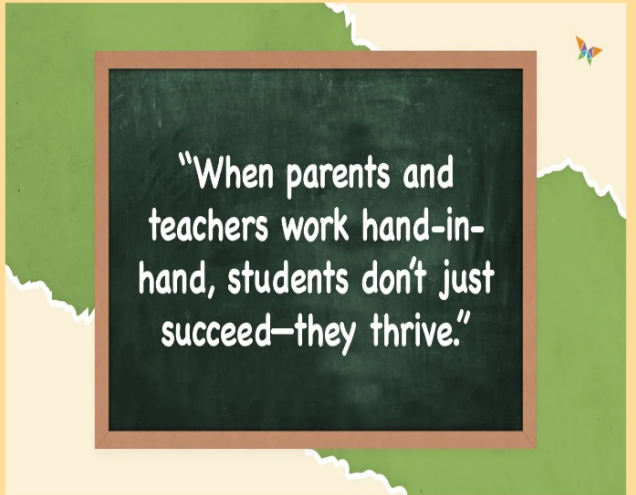
